

SERVICES RENDER BY THE DEPARTMENT

- (i) Reception of victims on arrival at the Airport in Nigeria.
- (ii) Provision of information on the rights obligations and welfare of victims.
- (iii) Provision of temporary accommodation for at least a period of six weeks and could be extended if circumstance so demand.
- (iv) Provision of general welfare services throughout the period of stay in care of NAPTIP.
- (v) Provision of medical care and feeding through out their stay in NAPTIP.
- (vi) Provision of counseling services and psychosocial therapy.
- (vii) Carry out social enquiries and family tracing of vicims.
- (viii) Provision of career counseling services.
- (ix) Provision of in-house vocational training services.
- (x) Provision of life-skill services.
- (xi) Provision of family counseling services, family reunion where necessary.
- (xii) Referral to vocational training centres or vocational trade master for a minimum of six months to acquire skills.
- (xiii) Provision of trade equipments for empowerment.
- (xiv) Monitoring the victims for a period of 3 years before disengagement.
- (xv) Keep the victim under the watchful eyes of the divisional Police officer in her area of residence to prevent any form of reprisal attack from the trafficker
- (xvi) Keeping the victims under the watchful eyes of the community leaders and child protection network to keep track record of the victims.
- (xvii) Referring victims to state ministry of women affairs for further processing and assistance.
- (xviii) Referring victims to accredited NGOs for long time accommodation and vocational training service.
